Former Doctor Pleads Guilty to Operating Pill Mill

Columbus, Ohio – On July 15, 2021, former New Albany doctor, Khaled Amr, plead guilty to staging a break-in at his Columbus practice for a fraudulent insurance claim and running a pill mill. Amr was sentenced to spend five years on probation and ordered to forfeit more than a half-million dollars.

According to court records, Amr was operating a pill mill out of his practice, Columbus Pain Specialists, for more than seven years. Amr was selling oxycodone in exchange for financial kickbacks and staged a break-in at his practice to make a fraudulent insurance claim.

He was ordered to surrender his medical license and DEA registration as part of the terms of his probation. Amr was also ordered to pay a \$5,000 fine and forfeit more than \$524,000 that were proceeds of his criminal behavior.
