Responsible RestartOhio Guidance UPDATED 5/15/2020

On April 30, 2020, the Ohio Department of Health issued a Director's Stay Safe Ohio Order. This order permits all businesses, except those specifically <u>listed in the order</u>, to reopen or remain open as long as all workplace safety standards are met. The order implements uniform requirements that pharmacies, wholesalers, and other Board of Pharmacy licensees and registrants are required to comply with to remain open. Licensees **are strongly advised to review** the applicable <u>Responsible RestartOhio</u> <u>Requirements</u>. As a reminder, these requirements include the following:

- Ensure minimum of 6 feet between employees, if not possible, install barriers.
- Businesses must require all employees to wear facial coverings, except for one of the reasons specified in the <u>Responsible RestartOhio Requirements</u>.
- Ensure minimum 6 feet between customers/patients/etc.
- Employees must perform daily symptom assessment.
- Require employees to stay home if symptomatic.
- Require regular handwashing by employees.
- Place hand sanitizers in high-contact locations.
- Clean high-touch items after each use.

IMPORTANT: The above requirements are not an exhaustive list and licensees and registrants should consult the <u>Responsible RestartOhio Requirements</u> document for further information.

These requirements replace all previously issued guidance on how licensees are to maintain clean and sanitary conditions during COVID-19.

Drug Compounding Resolutions and Guidance During COVID-19 UPDATED 5/15/2020

Over the past two weeks, the FDA has issued updated policies on drug compounding:
