



Ohio Pharmacist Licensure by Reciprocity

Updated 6/18/2026

This guidance document is intended to provide a comprehensive overview of obtaining an Ohio pharmacist license via reciprocity. Please review this document in its entirety.

Criteria for licensure by reciprocity:

The Ohio Board of Pharmacy has outlined the criteria for licensure as a pharmacist by reciprocity in [section 4729:1-2-02 of the Ohio Administrative Code](#). These criteria include the following:

- Be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- Obtain a degree in pharmacy from a school of pharmacy approved by the Ohio Board of Pharmacy.
- Have met the applicable practical experience requirements by either:
 - Successfully obtained a Doctor of Pharmacy degree (Pharm.D.) after December 31, 2006, or
 - Obtained a minimum total of 1,740 hours of documented supervised practical experience in Ohio or any other state or jurisdiction. If necessary, the Board may grant internship credit for practice as a pharmacist.
- Hold an active license or registration to practice pharmacy, which is in good standing, in another state or jurisdiction.
- *If the applicant is a foreign pharmacy graduate, they shall obtain a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Committee (FPGEC) Certification as well as demonstrate proficiency in English by successfully completing the Test of English as a Foreign Language Internet-Based Test (TOEFL iBT).*

Application requirements and steps to obtain a pharmacist license by reciprocity in Ohio:

- 1. Submit a license transfer application to NABP through the electronic license transfer program (eLTP) via your [NABP e-profile](#).** Account creation instructions can be found on [NABP's website here](#). The eLTP application has a required fee of \$300 and \$100 for additional states paid to NABP. Once your application is successfully

processed, NABP electronically submits your application to the applicable board(s) of pharmacy for evaluation.

- 2. Submit an application for a pharmacist license to the Ohio Board of Pharmacy via eLicense Ohio.** Indicate the application type as Reciprocity. The reciprocity application has a required fee of \$337.50 and eLicense transaction fee of \$3.50 paid to the Board. Acceptable forms of payment include Visa, MasterCard, and Discover.

The application must be submitted electronically via eLicense Ohio; paper applications will not be accepted. If you do not have an eLicense Ohio account, you will need to create one. NOTE: An applicant's eLTP application submitted to NABP will not be reviewed until the reciprocity application and payment are received to the Board.

- 3. Submit fingerprints for Ohio BCI and FBI criminal records checks.** Applicants can choose to submit their fingerprints one of two ways:
 - (1) In person at a WebCheck agency, or
 - (2) Manual inked fingerprint impressions mailed directly to Ohio BCI.

The [Criminal Records Check Information guidance document](#) provides more information and guidance on how to obtain the correct background checks.

Please be advised that the Board must receive your background check results within six (6) months from the date the application was submitted to grant you access to the Ohio Pharmacy Law Course (step #4). The results of any previous background checks completed as part of your academic program or employment cannot be used for your Ohio pharmacist application.

- 4. Complete the Ohio Pharmacy Law Course within six (6) months.** Once an applicant completes the previous steps and their background check results are received by the Board, they will be eligible to complete the [Ohio Pharmacy Law Course](#). Applicants will receive an email from the Board with a link to access the course and their security code, which will allow them to log into the course website. *Please note, applicants ONLY have three attempts to pass the course. Failure to pass the course within three attempts will result in their application being abandoned and application fee forfeited. In addition, applicants only have six months to complete the course before their application is deemed abandoned and application fee forfeited.*

***Applicants who have not met the Board’s examination requirements will be required to take the Ohio MPJE or UMPJE. Please see FAQ 1 below.**

NOTICE TO ACTIVE-DUTY MILITARY PERSONNEL, AND MILITARY SPOUSES: This requirement does not apply to active-duty military personnel and military spouses. Those individuals are also not required to take the MPJE or UMPJE. For more information on veteran pathways to licensure, please visit: www.pharmacy.ohio.gov/PharmVet.

Once an applicant completes the course or examination if required, the applicant will be issued a license. Notification will be sent via email. An official wall certificate will be sent by mail approximately six to eight weeks after licensure is awarded.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q1) Will I be required to take the Ohio MPJE or UMPJE*?

A1) Any pharmacist applicant for reciprocity initially licensed on or after January 1, 2018, and who has not successfully passed any state or jurisdiction’s MPJE, the UMPJE, or an approved state law examination, will be required to take either the Ohio MPJE or UMPJE. Approved state law examinations are Arkansas, California, and Puerto Rico.

Applicants must register for the Ohio MPJE or UMPJE via their NABP e-Profile and pay the required fees. Applicants will be given one year of eligibility to take and pass the exam. If after one year, an applicant has not successfully passed the Ohio MPJE or UMPJE, the application will be abandoned, and the application fee forfeited.

***Please note:** For examination dates of October 1, 2026 or later, Ohio will **only** accept the Uniform MPJE (UMPJE).

Q2) What if I am unable to complete the law course within six months of being granted access to the course by the Board?

A2) Your Ohio pharmacist application will be abandoned and fee forfeited. You must reapply for licensure by reciprocity via eLicense Ohio and pay the required fee.

Q3) Do I have to hold a license or registration to practice pharmacy in another state for any period of time before I can apply for reciprocity to Ohio?

A3) No, Ohio regulations do not have a “waiting period” or minimum practice requirements before a pharmacist can apply for reciprocity.

Q4) I am a recent graduate from a school of pharmacy and have applied to transfer my NAPLEX score to Ohio, do I have to also complete the license transfer application (eLTP) with NABP?

A4) No, graduates who have requested a NAPLEX score transfer do not need to complete the eLTP application. Instead, the graduate shall take an approved law examination. eLTP is only suitable for those pharmacists with an existing license. Please refer to [this guidance document](#) for specific requirements for applicants applying by examination.

Q5) I have completed all of the requirements but have not yet received my license, can I practice pharmacy in Ohio while my application is still “In Review”?

A5) No, you may not practice as a pharmacist in Ohio unless you hold a current, active Ohio pharmacist license to practice. It is a misdemeanor of the third degree to practice pharmacy in Ohio without a current Ohio license. A monetary penalty of \$500.00 may be imposed by the Board for each day of practice without a license, and a person may also be imprisoned for not more than sixty days for each day’s violation.

Once an applicant has completed all of the reciprocity requirements, the Board will issue the license in 5-7 business days. Any questions regarding your license can be sent directly to new.license@pharmacy.ohio.gov.
